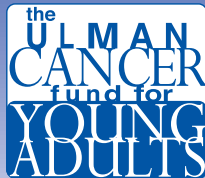

Why do Young Adults need to be aware of the fight against cancer?

- Cancer among the adolescent and young adult population is a significant health problem in the United States.*
- In the US, one in every seventy persons develops cancer between the ages of twenty and forty.*
- The incidence of cancer among young adults has been on the rise and the causes of these cancers and the increased incidence are not known.*
- More than 70,000 people each year between the ages of 18–40 are diagnosed with cancer.*
- Cancer is becoming a chronic disease for many cancer survivors.*
