Centennial Grad Ulman Starts Fund To Help Cancer Sufferers

Doug Ulman was diagnosed with cancer last August. The 19-year-old Brown University student, a 1994 first-team All-Metro soccer player at Centennial, had a tumor and a portion of a rib removed during an August operation. The experience of being a young adult cancer patient has left him determined to help others in that position.

He is forming a non-profit fund, The Ulman Fund of the Wellness Community, toward that end. One of the fund-raising activities will be a college all-star soccer game to be played on August 7. A kickoff banquet also will be held June 17 at Pimlico Race Track, featuring guest speakers, a silent auction and entertainment.
